to 18 Jan. Friday 11 P.M. when he died in great suffering. Upper part
of lungs congested. 9 yrs. 6 mos. & 14 days.

Father, Geo. W. Cooper & 2 sisters, Mary & Hattie came from Plainville
Maple st. to Orin's funeral Sunday Jan. 20th 1901.

Geo. W. Cooper was a Jamaican & came here to this County & lived
with Miss Posters Farmington 15 yrs. He says at 30 yrs. I was
worth \$10,000 but later it was stolen from me.

For 3 yrs. just he & two daughters have kept house in a
plain single way now one is 8 yrs. and other 13 yrs.

Orrin Cooper, a 10 year-old boy, died Friday at the County Home, after a week's sickness with pneumonia. Funeral services were held Sunday afternoon from the home, Rev. J. A. Wood officiating, and the remains buried in Springdale cemetery. The boy, with his brother, was committed to the home five years ago from Farmington. His father and two sisters, who live at Plainville, were present at the funeral. The death rate at the County Home has been very low, this being only the fourth to occur since Superintendent Adams took charge, four years ago. With the exception of a few colds, there is no sickness at the home at present.
